96TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY BILLS - 2010

1) HB 4658 – Credit History/Employment

Rep. Franks (D – Woodstock)/
Sen. Harmon (D – Oak Park)
SUPPORT

Prohibits employers from checking a potential employee's credit history and further outlaws denying employment to those with poor credit histories. Provides for a civil action remedy in circuit court for job seekers or current employees that are discriminated against because of their credit history. Allows certain financial institutions and state agencies to perform extensive background checks, including credit checks, in certain circumstances.

2) HB 4886 – Four Day School Week

Rep. Black (D – Danville)/
Sen. Frerichs (D – Champaign)
OPPOSE

Provides that a school district may, by board resolution, adopt an alternative school calendar for a 4-day school week, which must be approved by the State Board of Education. Requires a minimum of at least 150 days to ensure 141 of actual pupil attendance. Labor's opposition with this legislation is due to the concern of reduced salaries for cafeteria workers and bus drivers (typically wage/hour employees), additional child care costs for working families on nonschool days, and keeping students attentive during an extended day.

3) HB 4987 – Rail Safety

Rep. Holbrook (D – Belleville)/
Sen. Haine (D – Alton)
SUPPORT

Increases the penalty to a Class 4 felony for willfully placing an object or objects on active railroad tracks or railroad right of way which would adversely affect

safe railroad operations.

3/11/10 – Passed House 112-0-0.

4/27/10 – Passed Senate 56-0-0.

Passed both chambers.

4) HB 5154 - Disclosure Protections

Rep. ChapaLaVia (D - Aurora)/
Sen. Lightford (D – Chicago)
SUPPORT

Amends the Personnel Record Review Act. Prohibits the disclosure of public employee performance evaluations under the Freedom of Information Act.

3/11/10 – Passed House 70-39-0.

4/29/10 – Passed Senate 45-9-1.

Passed both chambers.

5) HB 5262 – Pensions

Rep. Hatcher (R – Yorkville)/
Sen. Bomke (R – Springfield)
SUPPORT

Allows state employees who were laid off the ability to purchase back the time spent on layoff once they are called back to work.

3/4/10 – Passed House 79-32-0.

4/29/10 – Passed Senate 53-0-1.

Passed both chambers.

6) HB 6112 – Prevailing Wage

Rep. Flider (D – Decatur)/
Sen. Haine (D – Alton)
SUPPORT

Requires payment of prevailing wage to and from (currently just to work site) a work site when hauling aggregate materials.

3/18/10 – Passed House 71-43-0.

4/21/10 – Held in Senate Labor, Re-referred to Senate Assignments.

7) SB 28 – McPier/McCormick Place

President Cullerton (D – Chicago)/
Speaker Madigan (D – Chicago)
OPPOSE

Democratic Leaders pushed legislation to severely restrict work rules, jurisdiction and overtime at Chicago's McCormick Place Convention Center. The legislation superseded collective bargaining agreements and will allow convention exhibitors to do work that has historically belonged to the 5 unions at McCormick Place (IBEW, Steelworkers, Iron Workers, Carpenters and Teamsters).

The Illinois AFL-CIO was opposed to this legislation, because work rules should be negotiated not legislated. The men and women who work at McPier take great pride in making it one of America's great convention destinations, and this legislation will undermine the quality of work performed.

8) SB 43 – Retiree Healthcare for Chicago Transit Authority Workers

Rep. Fritchey (D – Chicago)/
Sen. Raoul (D – Chicago)
SUPPORT

Provides that the Retiree Health Care Trust shall be solely responsible for providing health care benefits to eligible retirees and their dependents and survivors upon the exhaustion of the account established by the Retirement Plan for Chicago Transit Authority Employees. Allows CTA retirees to be offered an HMO option at a lower cost than current 90/70% PPO coverage. Clarifies that the actions to balance long-term projected income and expenses must be implemented within 10 years of the measurement of the imbalance. Allows RHCT to provide benefits to individuals with at least 25 years of service who were hired on or before September 5, 2001. Retirees would have to be at least age 55 and have over 10 years of service to be eligible.

9) SB 1946 – Two-tier Public Pensions
Senate President Cullerton (D – Chicago)/
Speaker Madigan (D – Chicago)
OPPOSE

The pension reform bill (SB 1946) will affect new hires who participate in all public pension systems, with the exception of local police and fire pension funds. It will raise the retirement age to raise the vesting period to 10 years, cost of living adjustment (COLA) would be reduced to 3% or half of CPI, whichever is less, at simple interest, prohibits public employee pensioners from collecting benefits if employed in another public employee position. Effective January 1, 2011.

Passed Senate 48-6-3.
4/14/10 – Signed by Governor, PA 96-0889.

10) SB 2494 – Tuition Vouchers
Sen. Meeks (D – Chicago)/
Rep. Will Davis (D – Chicago)
OPPOSE

Allows parents to obtain public tax vouchers paid for with tax payer money to cover the cost of private schooling. The Illinois AFL-CIO supports parental rights to send their children to private or religious schools, however, they oppose the use of public tax funds through vouchers to do so. The Illinois Constitution forbids the use of public funds for religious education. There is little to no accountability to the taxpayers in the use of voucher money.

5/5/10 – Failed in House 48-66-2.

11) SB 3047 – Health Care Implementation Task Force
Sen. Koehler (D – Peoria)/
Rep. Flowers (D – Chicago)
SUPPORT

Amends the Health Care Justice Act. Changes the short title to the Health Care Justice Implementation Act of 2010. Provides that the mission goals of the

Health Care Justice Implementation Task Force are to monitor the implementation of the federal health care reforms and make recommendations, to report regarding additional reforms needed to ensure affordable health care, and to assess current programs. Contains provisions concerning reports, public hearings, and research assessments. Effective July 1, 2010.

12) SB 3291 – Agencies
Sen. Koehler (D – Peoria)/
Rep. Colvin (D – Chicago)
SUPPORT

Beginning July 1, 2010, in order to attract and retain a stable, qualified, and healthy workforce, the Department of Human Services and the Department of Healthcare and Family services may reimburse individual community service providers serving individuals with developmental disabilities or an individual intermediate care facility for the developmentally disabled for spending incurred to provide improved wages and benefits to its employees serving developmentally disabled individuals. In order to qualify for a reimbursement, a provider or facility must submit to the appropriate agency, before January 1 of each year, documentation of a legally binding commitment to increase spending for the purpose of providing improved wages and benefits to its eligible employees during the next year.

4/22/10 – Passed House 113-0-0.
Passed both chambers.

13) SB 3566 – Abusive Work Environment Act
Sen. Delgado (D – Chicago)/
Rep. Washington (D – Waukegan)
SUPPORT

Creates the Abusive Work Environment Act. An abusive work environment is created when one acts with malice and subjects an employee to abusive

conduct to cause harm. It can include repeated verbal abuse, threatening physical conduct, sabotage of the employee's work performance, or an attempt to exploit an employee's psychological or physical vulnerability. Private right of action created and damages limited to \$25,000.

4/21/10 – Failed to pass House Labor committee

14) SB 3570 – Graduate Assistants
Sen. Forby (D – Benton)/
Rep. Jakobbson (D – Champaign)
SUPPORT

Amends the Illinois Educational Labor Relations Act to include pre-professional graduate assistants in the definition of educational employees. Allowing for pre-professional graduate employees to be represented for collective bargaining purposes if a majority of employees choose to do so. Guarantees these workers the same rights under the law as other graduate assistants.
3/17/10 – Passed Senate 34-15-1.
Referred to House Rules.
